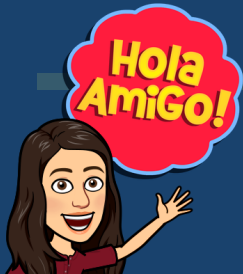


# Lower School Spanish

## Curriculum Overview

### Pre-K-K

- Follow simple routines in Spanish
- Learn basic vocabulary, including greetings, numbers, colors, family, and body parts
- Retell and act out simple stories in Spanish
- Explore countries and culture through books, songs and games

### Grades 1-2

- Communicate using basic conversational skills, including expressing emotions and using manners vocabulary appropriately
- Read and retell simple stories in Spanish
- Explore Spanish speaking countries, including Peru (Grade 1) and Mexico (Grade 2)

### Grades 3-4

- Communicate in more complex sentences, including describing oneself and others and expressing likes and dislikes
- Dive into thematic units, including hobbies and activities (Grade 3) and restaurant vocabulary (Grade 4)
- Explore Spanish speaking countries, including Venezuela (Grade 3) and the islands of the Caribbean (Grade 4)
